## Personal Statement

### Experience and qualifications

My name is Duncan Ross Harriss. I trained in medicine at Guy's Hospital Medical School, London qualifying (MBBS) in June 1986. I am a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS 1990) and I have passed the sub speciality examination in urology (FRCS Urol 1996). My research thesis investigated the intracellular mechanisms involved in normal bladder function (DM Nottingham 1994). My clinical research interests have included the epidemiology of prostate cancer and the treatment of bladder, urethral and prostatic disease. I was appointed Consultant Urological Surgeon at the Nottingham Urology Centre, City Campus, Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust on the 1st August 1997. My sub-specialist practice is pelvic surgical oncology including the diagnosis and treatment of kidney, prostate, bladder, testicular and penile cancer. Both my NHS and private practice include surgery for investigation and surgery for general urological disease (stones, prostate disease, erectile dysfunction and urinary incontinence). I have extensive medicolegal experience in claims related to gynaecological injury of the urinary tract and cauda equina syndrome.

I was Urology Clinical Director between 2000 and 2005. I was examiner for the subspecialty examination in urology for the Intercollegiate Speciality Board of the Royal College of Surgeons in England, Edinburgh, Glasgow and Dublin between 2006 and 2011. I am urology advisor to the Fitness to Practice panel of the General Medical Council. I am a Nottingham member of the Moynihan Chirurgical Club. I have been writing medical reports since 1997 (currently 200 per year) receiving instructions in cases of clinical negligence (80% Claimant and 20% Defendant) and personal injury. I am familiar with the Civil Procedure Rules.

I am an associate member of the Academy of Experts and I have been included in the medical expert database of The Action Against Medical Accidents (AvMA) charity. I am registered as a member of Expert Witness. I have completed the British Association of Urological Surgeons (BAUS) sponsored Expert Witness Certificate by

the Medical Protection Society. I am a Tier One Expert for the Association of Personal Injury Lawyers (APIL).
